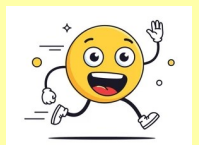

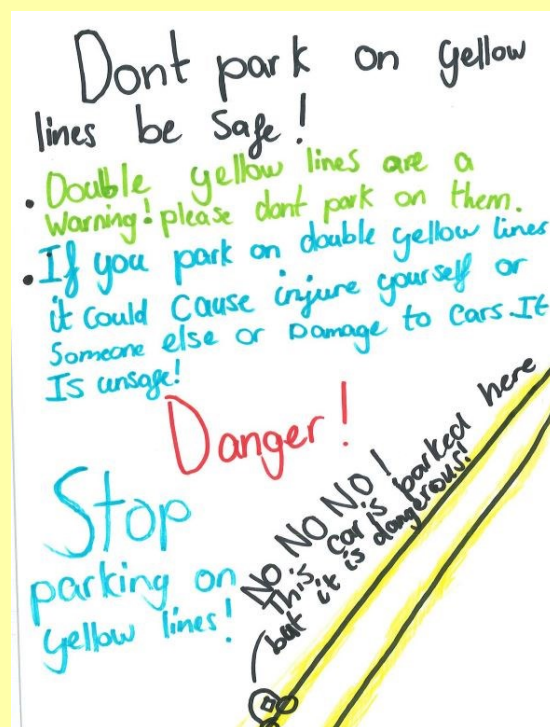
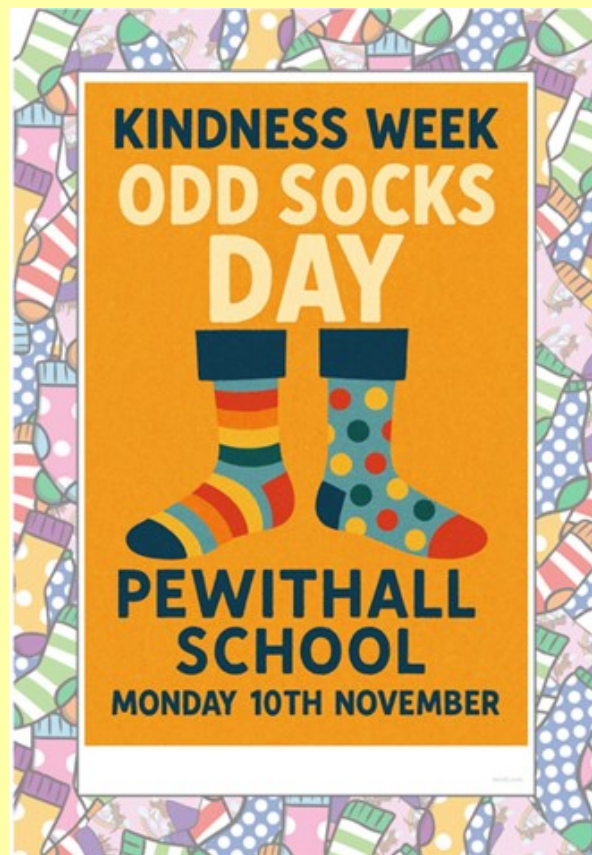
Busy Times at Pewithall!
