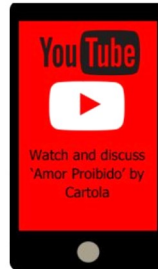
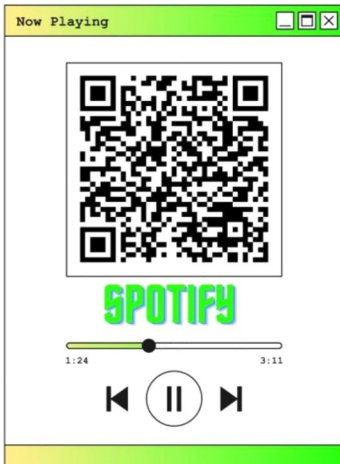


We had a wonderful assembly and playground parade. Thank you for all the fun!





# CARTOLA



**About:** Angenor de Oliveira, known as Cartola (Portuguese for top hat), (October 11, 1908 – November 30, 1980) was a Brazilian singer, composer and poet considered to be a major figure in the development of samba. Cartola composed, alone or with partners, more than 500 songs. It was not until he was rediscovered at the age of 66 that his music was recorded and he finally became recognised in his home nation and internationally for the music he had been playing most of his life.

**Origin:** Rio de Janeiro, Brazil

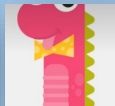

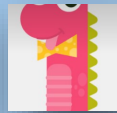
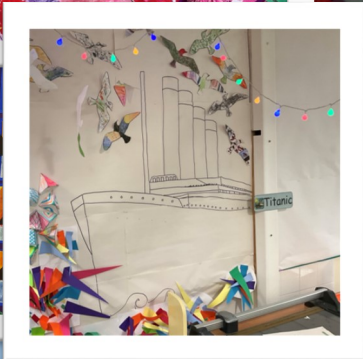


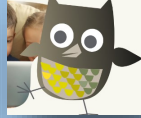
Our Year Four children have been doing some awesome practical work on states of matter, They were looking at the differences between solids, liquids and gases and how they change.
